RESOURCES for Adolescent Parents (R.A.P.)



What is RAP? Resources for Adolescent Parents (RAP) is a New Directions program that offers young women who are pregnant or parenting, under 18 or extended in care past 18, the support they need to keep going to school to work toward earning their high school diploma.

What should I expect from RAP?

You will be in a smaller class with other teens in a supportive environment. You will have someone to encourage you in setting goals for school/employment/career and other aspects of your life.

What classes can I take? You will be enrolled in "Just Learning" a Gordon Bell High School classroom where you can work at your own pace.

What else does the program

offer? RAP offers childcare (Gordon Bell Child Care Lab), counselling services, support during and after pregnancy and information on Health & Nutrition.

RAP also offers a monthly bus pass, a cash incentive for coming to school, working hard and earning high school credits and RAP offers snacks and lunch.

What happens when I turn 18?

RAP offers a Mature Student diploma.
